REQUEST UNDER ENVIRONMENTAL INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2004

We refer to your request for information, received by email on 2nd March 2019. The information you have requested is environmental information, as defined in Regulation 2 of the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 (EIRs). The Park Authority has an obligation to deal with your request under the EIRs and an option to also deal with your request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA), unless the public interest lies in dealing with your request solely under the EIRs. We consider that the public interest in dealing with your request under the EIRs outweighs the public interest in also dealing with your request under FOISA, on the basis that the public interest is not served by duplicating consideration of your request under both regimes. We have therefore applied the exemption in section 39(2) of FOISA and dealt with your request under the EIRs alone.

Your specific requests and the response from the National Park Authority are provided below.

"Having noted that all four cases of breach of the byelaws that took place last year which were referred to the Procurator Fiscal involved campervans, I wish to understand the reason for this. The least troublesome route for us all would be if you could explain why this is the case, but if you are not prepared to do this I would like to ask for the following information:

- 1) Please provide any information the LLTNPA holds on the outcome of the four cases you referred to the Procurator Fiscal
- 2) Please provide the location for each offence and any information which the LLTNPA used to determine whether the location formed part as a road as defined under the camping byelaws and the Roads Scotland Act"

In our response to you Ref EIR 2018/031 (dated 16th Nov 2018) we provided information on four reports to the Procurator Fiscal for breaches of the camping byelaws in 2018, broken down by reason for the referral.

We subsequently clarified our response to you in a letter dated 26th Nov 2018, attached again for your information, after identifying an error in the information provided in our initial response. We can confirm that none of these cases involved campervans or motorhomes. Accordingly we have LOCH LOMOND & THE TROSSACHS NATIONAL PARK AUTHORITY

Review Procedure
